

Day Ladies Inclement Weather Policy
Effective for games from November 1st to March 31st

All games will proceed as scheduled unless there is: a weather advisory issued by the City of Ottawa asking that all residents are to stay off the roads. If a weather advisory is issued the Day Ladies president will contact match chairs and they will cancel the games for the next day based on the advisory.

If the City of Ottawa issues a weather advisory all members will be notified by 8 pm the night before in the event of a game cancellation. The Day Ladies president will send out an e-mail advising the members that there will be no games for the next day. Match will determine, at a later date, how to address the lost game or whether a make-up game is possible in the calendar.

When there is not a cancellation, but one team wishes to cancel anyway, the skip must contact their opponent's skip and indicate their wish to cancel. If the skips agree to cancel their game, it is their responsibility to contact all the members of their teams. The skips may choose to call the game a tie or reschedule before the end of the round. They must then contact the appropriate match chair with their decision. If the decision is to reschedule, they must check with the club manager to find available ice time that is agreed upon by both teams. If the game is not made up before the end of the round, it will be considered a tie by match.

When there is not a cancellation, if one team still wants to play the game that day, but the other team wishes to cancel they must default the game.

All Day Ladies members will need to check their emails any time there is impending bad weather on Tuesday or Thursday mornings to check if the games for the next day have been cancelled. This decision will be made by the night before the game by 8 pm. This policy has been made to ensure the safety of all our members. Please keep in mind that we have some members who live quite close to CHCC and some who live further away and in some cases outside the city limits. Driving issues need to be assessed by each individual member based on their own circumstances, and their ability to get to the club safely. Members who feel that they are not able to safely drive from their home to CHCC even if games are not cancelled, should contact their skip and not attempt to drive to the club that day! Your personal safety should be your main priority!
